The assembly was around cyber-bullying and general safety online, as well as keeping safe within the community. PCSO Romek shared his own personal experiences as well as what would happen if there were reports of cyber-bullying. There was a clear message through the assembly that a) we must know who we are talking to online b) we must always speak to a trusted adult if we are worried about something. PCSO Romek said that when we are walking about in the community, we should keep our phones out of site and always walk in areas that are clearly lit and not to take short cuts through paths.

We are very lucky to have such a supportive police force in Ladybrook; PSCO Romek and other members of the team pop in most weeks and have a coffee, biscuits and a chat with Mrs Hallam. This was followed by a walk around the academy to say hello to all the pupils. PSCO Romek always remarks about how beautiful the academy is and how smart and well behaved the children are.
