With the use of PLPS, the trust and high-quality equipment we intend to provide a high-quality PE curriculum they will allow children to make progress in all aspects of PE starting in EYFS through to year 6. The focus on developing fine and gross motor skills in EYFS will provide children with better opportunities to progress in PE as they go through school but will also improve their chances at developing skills to write and make progress in other areas of the curriculum. Allowing children amble opportunities in sport, PE lessons and extracurricular activities will help and support them to live a healthy and active lifestyle that will help children become more successful in all aspects of school life. With the trips, clubs and extracurricular activities will provide children with opportunities that they do not have access to elsewhere, aiming to give them a wider range of skills to be successful in school and beyond.
